NOOR Foundation and KEYSTONE are pleased to invite visual storytellers to apply for a five days, intensive Masterclass in documentary photography and visual storytelling led by NOOR photographer Tanya Habjouga (US/Jordan).

«Politics of Place & Rabbit Holes | Practices in Visual Storytelling» (Developing Your Personal & Long Term Projects)

Discussing her own projects and her unique path through photography, Tanya will share key insights, strategies and tools for participants to develop, sustain and publish their own personal and long-term projects.

Key components will be exploring an interdisciplinary approach, borrowing and merging practices from conceptual art, anthropology, theatre, diary writing, editorial portraiture, long-term narrative and investigative journalism.

The Masterclass will feature a daily intro lecture from Tanya, along with group editing and intensive one-on-one sessions to deconstruct/reconstruct/and re-imagine conceptual approaches to students' personal projects.

We will also explore dynamic approaches to proposal writing for grants to assist in financing a long-term project.

We will delve into approaches to move beyond a linear narrative and create a «felt experience» for your audience. We will explore how to dig deeper into the politics of the place, through the use of evidentiary and metaphorical approaches, encouraging photographers to incorporate the humane, personal, and collaborative into the unexpected, to take a more expansive, creative view on documentary photography. Ultimately, you should leave this Masterclass ready to take your personal project to new intimate heights.

5 day Masterclass Course Objectives:

To share key insights, strategies and tools for participants to develop, sustain and publish their own personal and long-term projects; to inspire and push participants to take a more expansive, creative view on documentary photography.

Tutor



Tanya Habjouqa

(Jordan, 1975) is a Jordanian / Texan documentary photographer and educator. Her work is born out of long-term investments and collaborative methodology, blending ethnographic research and reportage. Known for producing sensitive work underscored by the absurd, her long-term projects focus on gender, representations of otherness, dispossession, and ever-shifting sociopolitical dynamics in MIDEAST. Her «Occupied Pleasures» was heralded by TIME magazine and Smithsonian as one of the best photo books of 2015 (winning her a World Press Photo award in 2014). She mentors emerging photographers from across the Arab region for Magnum Foundation's «Emerging Arab Photographer Documentary Fund» together with the Prince Claus Foundation and the Arab Fund for Arts and Culture. Tanya is a member of NOOR and one of the founding members of *Rawiya*, the first all female photo collective of the Middle East. She is based in East Jerusalem.

The Masterclass will be conducted in English and is limited to 7 participants maximum.

Requirements

- Intermediate experience in photography (especially photojournalism and documentary photography)
- English fluency
- Professional technical understanding of your camera equipment
- * BE PREPARED TO BRING YOUR LONG TERM PROJECT (or well researched pitch/proposal/visual example) to the Masterclass. You should have either a longterm project or a concept to approach for a long-term project with samples beyond singles. Be prepared to give a five to seven minute «elevator pitch» on the first day to present yourself, your work, your project, and where you want to go in your practice.

IMPORTANT TO NOTE. Students should in addition to projects / visuals have items accessible: any writing or memorabilia (your own or of people in photos) as well as well researched topics so that time can be maximized together. It would be good if you have prints of pictures and also print out research / memorabilia if you don't have it physically on you, and supporting writing (by you or characters, diary etc). The more you have with you, the more we can create.
